



Protect Yourself from Fraud

Scams are designed to feel urgent and legitimate.

Before proceeding with a large cash withdrawal or unusual transaction, we encourage you to pause and consider the following:

Have You Recently:

- Been contacted by someone claiming to be from a company, government agency, or fraud department?
- Received a pop-up message on your computer directing you to click a link?
- Allowed someone access to your computer to “fix” an issue or investigate suspicious activity?
- Been told your bank account is at risk and instructed to move your money?
- Been asked to withdraw cash, purchase gift cards, or send money through apps like Zelle or Cash App?
- Felt pressure to act quickly or avoid speaking with family, friends, or a banker?
- Been instructed to keep the purpose of your transaction private?

If This Feels Familiar

There’s a strong possibility you’re being targeted by a scam. These situations are designed to create urgency and bypass your instincts.

Pause. Funds sent through cash, gift cards, or digital transfers are often not recoverable.

What to Do

- Speak with a Pegasus banker before completing your transaction
- Do not share sensitive information or send funds
- Take time to verify who you’re dealing with
